

DUNURE COMMUNITY COUNCIL

Minutes of a Meeting held on Tuesday 18 February 2003 in the Kennedy Hall.

SEDERUNT: Carol Hayes (Chair), Jean McGinn (Secy), Adam Montgomerie (Vice Chair), Andrew Guthrie.

IN ATTENDANCE: Cllr Alan Murray, Andy Stewart (SAC).

1. APOLOGIES: Roy Storie, J Munro, J Eaglesham.

2. ADOPTION OF PREVIOUS MINUTES: Proposed by A Guthrie. Seconded by A Montgomerie.

Prior to adoption of minutes C Hayes had objected to the word "small" in last paragraph regarding housing development at Fisherton. This word has been deleted.

3. MATTERS ARISING:

Paths: A Montgomerie reported there had been people out discussing with farmer the path over hill to Maybole. They are looking to getting this path opened up in the near future. Cllr Murray also has spoken about the path from village to Cemetery to see if something can be done here.

Doo'cot: Roy Storie reported this work due to commence very soon. Builder has expressed doubts about the stability of the wall at the second stringer, so work may be more complicated and expensive than first realised. Passed on details of key holders for park and toilets for access.

Seaview: Cllr Murray has written to Council about signage here. T Masterman had asked A Guthrie for an update on this.

New Sewerage Treatment Programme: Cllr Murray has been advised a review is being carried out and when this is completed a representative from Scottish Water is willing to come along and give a presentation.

Butterfly Garden: Has not so far been strimmed.

Area for turning at North Carrick Place: Will be attended to within the next two weeks.

Technology Bus: No date confirmed as yet.

Kennedy Hall & Park Committee: C Hayes as yet no reply to letter to Council asking for some funding.

Fisherton School: "Slow" signs will be erected before end of financial year.

Fisherton School: Work on the inside toilets and nursery room due to start.

A Guthrie made up a list of equipment to aid litter collection and passed same to Cllr Murray.

A Guthrie has cleared bags of cans and litter from bus stop at harbour and surrounding ditches.

R Storie had a note to ask if the area of the Electric Brae could be cleaned.

Cllr Murray has been advised that the litter which accumulates when ditches are cleaned should be removed at that time. Asks that he be advised when this work is being done.

White lines painted on Lagg Brae now but not through village.

New road surface through village still not repaired and gave details of other areas mainly Fisherton Farm to School where there are numerous potholes.

A Guthrie again explained to Cllr Murray the area at the Heads of Ayr Caravan Park where a bit of hard standing for bus stop is needed.

Water at Spring Garden: Cllr Murray had written re water running down road at Spring Garden Cottage.

5. FINANCIAL REPORT:

New Hall Account £2392.52

Administration Account Balance £485.77.

In a letter from Mr Storie he points out that after we have paid Secretary's Honorarium and cost of audit we will still have about £200.00 left in account. Asks for ways we could use this. A Guthrie suggested we give £50.00 towards the Church Newsletter. As this is an administration account it should only be used for expenses which come under that heading. Everyone agreed the Church Newsletter is a valid

case as it can be used as a medium to communicate with the village. A Stewart confirmed the money must be used by the end of March.
