

DUNURE COMMUNITY COUNCIL

Minutes of a meeting held on Tuesday 17 June 2003 in the Kennedy Hall.

1. APOLOGIES: S Hudson, PC Jim McGarry.

2. ADOPTION OF PREVIOUS MINUTES: Proposed by Adam Montgomerie. Seconded by R Storie.

3. MATTERS ARISING:

Seaview: Money is now available for the erection of new signs directing pedestrians round back of Seaview.

New Sewerage Treatment Programme: Secretary has been in contact with Kenny Naylor of Scottish Water who is agreeable to attend our meeting on 19th August at 7.30pm. He will then be in a position to explain the new programme and will also be prepared to answer questions. The project will be sited north of the village and legislation demands that Scottish Water improves treatment of waste water in existing pipe work, but this does not include connection to Fisherton unless SEPA has specific concerns regarding this. The project will not commence before February 2004. Secretary will confirm Mr Naylor's attendance on 19 August. A notice will be placed in notice boards inviting members of the village to attend this meeting.

Fisherton School: "Slow" signs now in position but members commented on the fact that they flash erratically, and sometimes fail to switch off.

Electricity Pylons: Work still being done south of the village on renewal of pylons.

Kirkbride Cemetery: Fence has now been erected around the cemetery, but A Montgomerie states the grass has not yet been strimmed.

Pot Holes: Cllr Murray confirms these are being attended to and members agree there seems to be an improvement to the road surfaces at the moment.

Maybole Community Development Group: While this has been disbanded, the Community Association aims to go forward and try to obtain grants for various

projects. There is a "Fairshare" meeting in Maybole on 28 June and a funding day in the County Buildings on 23 June. It is hoped members will be able to attend.

Ayr Hospital: Cards had been received regarding Children's care at Ayr Hospital. These were distributed to be completed and returned.

Path behind Garages at Bus Stance: Council are awaiting an engineer's report here.

Kennedy Hall: Councillor Murray has spoken to J McCreath, Secretary of the Kennedy Hall & Park Committee, suggesting they ask for a substantial grant from the common enhancement fund specifically for the roof or the kitchen. Council officers will be meeting soon to review hall situations and this is the only South Ayrshire village Hall with no Council support.

4. POLICE REPORT:

P C McGarry sent his apologies for this evening and also intimated he was off sick at the time of the AGM. A note had been passed to him re attempted petrol theft, and also there had been a break-in at the Farm Park. These seem to be unrelated incidents and the result of opportunists. He had been given the names of three girls who had allegedly been involved in vandalism to the telephone box. He would speak to these girls during the school holidays.

A Guthrie commented on the fact that the last time plans were drawn up, were advised the Council was too involved, as the community have to be seen to be more involved.
