

## **DUNURE COMMUNITY COUNCIL**

Minutes of a Meeting held on Tuesday 19th October 2004 at 7.00pm in the Kennedy Hall.

**1. APOLOGIES:** Mr Roy Storie, Mr John Eaglesham.

**2. ADOPTION OF PREVIOUS MINUTES:** Proposed by David Broadhead, Seconded P Findlay.

### **3. MATTERS ARISING:**

**SCOTTISH WATER SOLUTIONS:** Minutes of meeting 6 October circulated. Paul Maxwell to be contacted for update on the site for Pumping Station No1 (Seaview) as we hope to have him back to a meeting in the near future. Plans for Outfall are on show in Kennedy Hall, as advertised in Ayrshire post on 15 October. Steve Hudson informed that there seems to be concern in the village with the height and extent of the pumping station at Seaview, and villagers are prepared to take action against this. Councillor Murray commented that the Planning Department couldn't refuse this application so long as planning requirements are met.

**BUTTERFLY GARDEN:** Signs now ready for erection. A Guthrie hopes to have word on this before long. Some of children from Fisherton School drew ideas for these signs. Once these are in place, perhaps it would be possible to have some of the children involved photographed at the signs.

**4. POLICE REPORT:** P C Hamil attended our meeting and informed us he has just started in the post of Community Policeman. He had taken the time to go through the reports for the last few months, and advised us there had been one alcohol related incident; one neighbour dispute; a car had been stolen and subsequently found burned out; a theft of tyres and wheels for trailer at harbour; and a fraud case in Ayr Road in which the culprits had been apprehended and are awaiting trial. Mr Findlay expressed his concern about the speed of traffic on Station Road (even within the 30 mph speed limit) and P C Hamil will try and get traffic to come with speed camera. P C Hamil is also happy to hear from us with any issues on which we may be concerned.

**5. COUNCILLOR'S REPORT:** There has been a meeting with residents of

Fisherton Cottages and Road Safety because of the ongoing problem of road accidents at this spot. Photographs have been taken and it has been decided that as the white lining has almost disappeared, remarking of a better quality, reflecting studs, and chevrons to advise of bend should help. This will be done once this part of the road is re-surfaced. This is due to be done in the near future.

The group in Maybole, which was formerly MCDG, is applying for a Rural Village Grant and Rural Challenge Fund, which will fund a Rural Worker for 2 years.

A Montgomerie replied to a letter from Maytag regarding maintenance of path over hill, and pledged our support.

It was unanimously agreed to renew our membership with CVO at £10 annually.

Councillor Murray will get wreath for Remembrance Sunday, which is Sunday 14 November. There will be a short ceremony and laying of wreaths at 1pm at Dunure Cemetery.

Mr Ian Hay asks for the bus stop at the school to read "both ways" as there is no bus stop on the west side of Ayr Road at that stop. Councillor Murray will pass this request to the appropriate department.

It was also mentioned the bus stop on the east side of the road at the Heads of Ayr Caravan Park has still not been made safe with a proper standing area.

Mr Hudson asks for railings at the bottom of the lane from Carrick Place to Kennedy Drive opposite 37 Kennedy Drive, as objects have been rolled down this and caused damage to cars parked on the road at the foot.
