### **1. APOLOGIES:** S Hudson

**Chairman, Mr Adam Montgomerie,** introduced Mr Paul Maxwell from Scottish Water Solutions who did a quick resume of previous presentations by them in respect of the Dunure Waste Water Treatment Project. He and the other experts then went on to explain at length the construction details. The cost of this project is estimated to be £2M, and the time scale will be in the region of 30 weeks. It was pointed out by him that at various times the road may be closed between the construction site in the Croft field on Station Road, and the foot of Kennedy Drive.

Mr McCrindle asked for details on length of outfall pipe, which will be 400 metres and on the seabed.

Residents of Seaview were surprised and shocked at the size of No 1 Pumping Station, which is to be sited on the shore adjacent to the north end of Seaview. (Various plans were circulated at the meeting). Objections have been raised to the planning department and other sites were suggested. Mr Maxwell has agreed to get the area pegged out by the contractors so that the public are aware of the size of this pumping station.

The planning meeting takes place on 5 October and it was suggested these plans be held over until this site is re-considered. Once this has been done a meeting will be held to answer queries, which may arise. This pumping station is needed to pump all sewerage from the harbour area properties up to the main pipe at the top of Harbour View.
