

DUNURE COMMUNITY COUNCIL

Minutes of a Meeting held on Tuesday 18th January 2005 in the Kennedy Hall.

1. APOLOGIES: Mrs Dympna Gardiner.

2. ADOPTION OF PREVIOUS MINUTES: Proposed by S Hudson. Seconded by D Broadhead.

3. MATTERS ARISING:

SCOTTISH WATER SOLUTIONS: At a meeting with Scottish Water in Kennedy Hall on Monday 22 November at 7.30pm, there was a good turn out of local residents. Scottish Water showed a rough drawing of a proposal to site the pumping station on the foreshore in front of the Hall, and hoped to make it smaller than the original plans. Other sites were discussed but Scottish Water insisted this was their preferred option. They will come back to the Community Council or to an open meeting when the new plans have been completed. It was decided this meeting should be separate from the monthly Community Council meeting, and that we should ask that they get back to us BEFORE the plans are re-submitted.

BUTTERFLY GARDEN: There was a photograph taken at the school with the pupils who were involved in the design of the signs for the Butterfly Garden. This was in the Ayrshire Post.

ALL WEATHER GAMES AREA: Funding has been turned down for this but other sources are now being investigated.

4. POLICE REPORT: P C John Hamil confirms only one incident in the village of vandalism since the last meeting. He gave us information on the "speed gun" for use by Community Police, and it was agreed to donate £100 towards this. This should be done before end of financial year. The cost of this is in excess of £1200 and donations have been promised from other Community Councils in the area. P C Hamil had to leave to attend another meeting.

5. COUNCILLOR'S REPORT: Councillor Murray was able to confirm that the bus stop at Ayr Road, Fisherton, will be attended to eventually, as will the hard standing at East side of road at caravan park at Heads of Ayr.

Regarding the erection of railings at the bottom of Carrick Place/Kennedy Drive lane, this was assessed and found there is not enough room to install these. The Community Council members disagree with this.

Councillor Murray informed the Community Council that the A719 between Fisherton School and Fisherton Farm was due to be re-surfaced at the end of February/beginning March, and in order to complete this in the shortest time possible it would be necessary to close the road completely between the hours of approximately 9.15am and 3.00pm. A diversion would be in place via Maybole. The work should then only take between three and five days.

9. ANY OTHER BUSINESS:

Mr Eaglesham reported that the Kennedy Hall bins were blown away during the storms. It was suggested they might need to be secured somehow.

Mr Storie had photographs of potholes in Station Road to pass on to Councillor Murray, and it was felt that the short term filling in of these is false economy.

Mr Findlay commented on the problem of dog fouling especially round the harbour area, and wondered if leaflets round the village to ask residents to ensure they clean up after their dogs.

Mr Storie explained that the Community Association, which was set up to assist in fund raising for village organisations, has now been disbanded. There seems to be no chance of any finance available towards a new village hall.

Secretary reminded the Community Council that South Ayrshire Council had paid the Public Liability Insurance up until end March 2005. After that, we will have to see what happens.

Secretary asked if anyone had received a South Ayrshire Council calendar, which was to have been distributed to all houses in South Ayrshire. No one has received this, which apparently has useful information on it.
