2. Adoption of minutes for meeting of 15 January 2008.
Proposed by Mr A Guthrie, Seconded Mrs M Masterman.
3. POLICE REPORT: P C Hamil reported that in January one person was reported for a disorderly offence. Asks that public be on their guard from door to door sellers who have no licence to do so.
4. COUNCILLOR'S REPORT: Councillor Goldie has reported the water on Lagg Brae, which seems to be coming off the field during heavy rain. Ditches may have been cleared in this area. The bus parking area was discussed as no white lines have been painted for designated parking bays. Apparently white lining is more expensive than yellow and this will be done eventually. Mr Guthrie has requested new bins for Kennedy Park and Councillor Goldie will pass this on to the appropriate department. Hopefully the new flashing lights will be in place near Fisherton School during March as advised to Mrs McKinley by Mr Wyllie.
5. MATTERS ARISING:
 - Civic Pride: The money has been received for speed bumps and tables for hall and we will get these ordered as soon as possible. They will be delivered to Mr Findlay. Secretary advises that this money will only be available until end of March. Mr Storie hopes to get an estimate for the removal of graffiti.
 - Web Site: Mr Macleod has nothing further to add as still awaiting transfer from Mr Hayes.
 - Pumping Station: The work has now commenced on this project.
 - Graffiti: Mr Storie is trying to get an estimate here for the work to be done as we would like to see the castle clean before the tourist season. We may be able to use Civic Pride money for this.
 - Labyrinth: Mr Guthrie is hopeful that funding will be found for this and the construction will depend on the amount of money received. He hopes to involve the primary school children in this project.

- Fisherton School has now received grant for raised beds and members of the Community Council have volunteered to help the children erect these beds in April.
- Mr Findlay remarked on the state of the road verges south of Fisherton Cottages where large vehicle or vehicles seem to be cutting the corners and damaging the roadside. Buses may cause this.
- The roadside opposite the new Pumping Station is getting damaged with vehicles turning in to the site. This is a point which should be raised with Scottish Water.
